

PAT – PATIENT INFORMATION

- Patient Name
 - PAT07, PAT08, PAT09

Information should be reported according to the most recently published version of the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA) Naming Policy Framework 2023: Essential Person Demographic Data Elements for Electronic Health Information

- Report the patient's complete legal name as listed on a government-issued ID
- **Do NOT report extraneous information or comments** Deliver to back door, check ID, delivery, nursing home
- **Do NOT report special characters, other than hyphen** New fields for nickname, alias, previous name, or mother's maiden name

PAT – PATIENT INFORMATION

- Veterinary Patient
- PDMP TTAC/NASCSA Recommended Best Practices for Veterinary Prescriptions (11/2021)
 - Should be owner's name and DOB if for an animal, or as required by state regulation
 - Use PAT20 to indicate if for a veterinary patient and enter name of animal in PAT23
 - If ownership by an entity: Enter information of PERSON responsible for the care of the animal or who arranges for the animal's veterinary care
- PAT28 (Veterinary Species Code)
- PAT29 (Animal Location Code)

- DSP04 (Refills Authorized) Increase 2 → 4 digits
- DSP06 (Fill Number)
 - Increase 2 \rightarrow 4 digits

• PRE09 (XDEA Number)

- Field decommissioned due to DEA eliminating DATA-Waiver Program per Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023
- Field will not be used for other purposes

PRE – PRESCRIBER INFORMATION

Prescriber Location

Aligns with SUPPORT Act

``(1) The program facilitates access by a covered provider to, at a minimum, the following information with respect to a covered individual, in as close to real-time as possible:

"(C) The name, location, and contact information (or other identifying number selected by the State, such as a national provider identifier issued by the National Plan and Provider Enumeration System of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services) of each covered provider who prescribed a controlled substance to the covered individual during at least the most recent 12-month period."

Information should be reported according to the most recently published version of the Project US@ Technical Specifications for Patient Addresses

PRE – PRESCRIBER INFORMATION

- PRE11 (Prescriber Address Information 1)
- PRE12 (Prescriber Address Information 2)
- PRE13 (Prescriber City Address)
- PRE14 (Prescriber State Address)
- PRE15 (Prescriber Zip Code Address)

Recommendation: Information should be reported according to United States Postal Service Publication 28-Postal Addressing Standards or the most recently published version of the ONC Project US@ Technical Specifications for Patient Addresses.

AIR - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REPORTING

- AIR11 (Dropping Off/Picking Up Identifier Qualifier)
 Add qualifier
 - 01 = Person Dropping Off
 - 02 = Person Picking Up
 - 03 = Mailing/Shipping
- Separated fields for Person Picking Up Rx (AIR03-19) vs. Person Dropping Off Rx (AIR20-32)

EARLY/INTERESTED ADOPTERS
