Project Objectives

- 1. Increase practitioner PDMP search rates
- Analyze and disseminate PDMP data to Local Health Departments and state partners



Objective 1 – Increasing PDMP Search Rates

- Collect feedback on barriers to PDMP searching
- Develop and disseminate practitioner education
- Analyze practitioner search rates
- Create and distribute Provider Reports
- Evaluate impact of interventions



Objective 2 – PDMP Data Analysis and Dissemination

- Create Data Reports for LHDs and state partners
- Focus on prescription stimulants, buprenorphine, and other controlled substances
- Incorporate social determinants of health data
- Collaborate with LHDs to tailor reports



Collaborative Approach

- Partner with New York State Association of County Health Officials (NYSACHO)
- Conduct meetings with LHDs, associations, and state partners



Timeline and Key Milestones

- Year 1: Survey development, initial data analysis, education creation
- Year 2: Report dissemination, impact evaluation



Expected Outcomes

- Improved practitioner PDMP search rates
- Enhanced use of PDMP data in overdose prevention planning
- Development of tailored Data Reports
- Established framework for PDMP data use in research
